Scheduled Blessings

#Due Season

Galatians 6:7-9 (NLT)

God has designed and even scheduled every believer to have a due season and has scheduled blessings for each of us. **John 10:10** applies to every believer, not just a select few. But to get to those blessings that are scheduled, we must walk by faith and not by sight—**2 Corinthians 5:7**.

The scheduled blessings are not automatic but are based on three things:

1. **Our Unified Position—Verse 9a**. God has so designed the body of Christ in a way that we are accountable and connected to one another—**Ephesians 4:16**. No believer can arrive at his/her due season alone. Paul says “let us not grow weary. We are in this together.”
 - A. ***We are all connected to a victorious Christ*—3:26-27**. Our position has changed. That means that we have joined Christ in His work—**Romans 6:3-4**.
 - B. ***We are called to serve*—5:13**. Because of our unified position, we are called to serve one another. In so doing, we demonstrate the love of Christ—**Galatians 6:1-3, Hebrews 10:23-24**.

2. **Our Unlimited Power—Verse 9b.** Paul says “let us not grow weary.” He could say this because of his past experience with Christ. He knew from experience when you really trust in Christ, you operate through the power of Christ, but one must be:

A. ***Surrendered to Christ—5:16, Philippians 2:12-14.***

B. ***Sharing—ministering to others.*** That’s what doing good is. It is not worship, but it is the result of real worship. It is not prayer but what prayer produces—**Galatians 6:2, 10; Acts 1:8.** The command is not to get tired of doing good, sharing and serving one another—**Isaiah 40:31.**

3. **Ultimate Promise**—A promise that cannot be broken. Each believer is promised to reap a harvest, but it is:

A. ***Conditional—we must not grow tired or give up—Verse 7.*** Never giving up means that as we continue to do good, continue to do God’s will, continue to walk by faith—we are constantly, planting, watering, and God is growing our harvest—**John 8:31-32.**

B. ***Certain—you will reap.*** Of course, the ultimate harvest is when we all become like Christ. But there is also a harvest while we are here on earth—**Mark 10:28-30** (NKJV).
